

**Wicked** spotlights the untold stories of the Wizard of Oz's most famous (or infamous) characters: the Wicked Witch of the West (Elphaba) and her unlikely friend, Glinda the Good Witch. As Elphaba—a passionate political activist if there ever was one—fights injustice and seeks to undo the mistakes of the past. The show explores the dark secrets and personal tragedies that shape the history of Oz.

Since opening on Broadway, *Wicked* has won 10 Tony Awards (including Best Musical), a Grammy Award for Best Musical Theater Album, 11 Drama Desk Awards, and 10 Outer Critics Circle Awards.
